PURPOSE OF JOB

The North Polers are at the heart of the Hideaway Christmas Family Experience, bringing to life the magic, warmth, and wonder of the Christmas Experience for children and families. This team ensures every visitor — from tiny tots to grandparents — feels immersed in the joy and excitement of Christmas.

Working as part of the wider event team, North Polers will oversee and run the whole experience, helping to create a seamless, memorable, and heartwarming experience for all. They'll embody the spirit of Santa's helpers — cheerful, kind, and organised — making sure every detail runs smoothly, from welcoming families and running themed activities, to maintaining the atmosphere and keeping everything on track behind the scenes.

At its heart, this role is about sharing joy, kindness, and connection, ensuring every family leaves with smiles, laughter, and a little bit of North Pole magic to take home.

MAIN DUTIES:

- Supervision of the activity zones, ensuring all visitors are safe, following instructions and respecting the equipment and props.
- Setting up and running activities, helping children to engage and understand what they're doing and why.



- Helping with reception, check-in or operating the tills and answering questions.
- Ensuring the whole experience is clean, safe, well maintained and picture perfect
- Ensuring safeguarding policies and best practices are followed.
- Helping in the café with food service and cleaning.
- Ensuring all activities have what they need to run, and assisting in the preparation of anything that may be running low.
- Ensuring customers are made aware of the work of The Hideaway, and inviting them to come along to play there too.
- Serving customers in a pleasant and courteous manner.
- Checking that orders have been correctly delivered and charged for.
- Clearing tables.
- Ensuring that any risk assessments are complied with.
- Reporting maintenance issues to the Manager or Team Leader
- Maintaining such records as are required by the Management
- Keeping accurate time sheets daily.
- Keeping cleaning and temperature records.
- To ensure that all duties are undertaken effectively and efficiently, in accordance with the required standards of service and care, with relevant Health & Safety legislation and in line with the values and ethos of the organisation.
- To undertake training as required.
- The role involves working with children and vulnerable adults, and the responsibilities to safeguarding that this involves.
